Keep Recyclables Empty, Clean & Dry!

China, the largest importer of recycables, recently implemented the National Sword policy which drastically reduced imports of contaminated recyclable material.

It is more important now than ever to properly sort your recyclables and keep them empty, clean and dry! China and all buyers of recyclables are accepting only the cleanest plastics and paper!

The most common contaminants in Oakland grey recycling carts are polystyrene foam, diapers, plastic bags, pizza boxes, electronics and clothing.

• Place foam, diapers, and plastic bags in the burgundy trash cart.

Place pizza boxes and other food soiled paper in the green compost cart.
If you aren't sure what goes where

check oaklandrecycles.com.

• Donate gently used clothing and other household items. If the item cannot be re-purposed or donated, then place it in the burgundy trash cart.

• Drop off electronics for free at the Alameda County Household Hazardous Waste facility. Contact: Stopwaste.org/recycling/residents/ household-hazardous-waste or (800) 606-6606. If you aren't sure what to do with other reusable items, check Recyclewhere.org.

Rest assured your truly recyclable materials are being recycled in Oakland!

Sort Recycling Properly!

Proper sorting is now more important than ever!

RECYCLING

• Empty liquids and food from all containers and if possible, rinse and dry before placing in the grey recycling cart.

*Wet paper and cardboard lose quality and may be rendered unrecyclable!

Do not bag recyclables.
 Place them loosely in the grey recycling cart.

*Recyclables are hand sorted and it is difficult for workers to open bagged recyclables.

 Include only recyclable material in the grey recycling cart.
 *If you are not sure which materials are recyclable, call: (510) 238-SAVE(7283) or go to: oaklandrecycles.com.

COMPOSTING

• Never put any glass, metal or plastic that is not BPI certified compostable in the green compost cart.

*The most common contaminants in the compost cart are plastic & glass!

• Put food-soiled paper in the compost, not grey recycling cart.

REDUCING

- Avoid purchasing products with excessive packaging.
- Go paperless with bills and bank statements.
- Stop junk mail, catalogs and phone book from arriving at your home. Learn how at Ecocycle.org/junkmail.
- Think twice before printing and print double-sided when you can.

REMEMBER REUSE IS BEST!

Bring your own bag, lunchbox, cup, utensils, straw, etc. Buy reusable gifts/gift wrap this holiday season!

After the Holidays, Compost Your Tree!

Set clean trees at the curb for collection on your regular compost collection day – During the first 2 weeks after the holidays.

• No "Snow" Flocking • No Stands • No Decorations (Flocked trees cannot be composted; they go to the landfill.)

All tree(s) must be cut to be under 4' and placed curbside. If you missed the Holiday Tree Pickup, cut trees to fit inside your Compost cart for regular collection.

Zero Waste Progress Report


Residents in Oakland's 1-4 unit properties are diverting well over 50% of the materials they dispose of from the landfill by using their weekly recycling and compost collection services. Diversion from 5+ unit properties is far lower.

State and local laws require multifamily property owners and managers to subscribe to recycling and composting services and to provide residents with access to these services.

If your 5+ unit building does not have recycling/composting collection services or if you require assistance training your residents to recycle right call (510) 613-2102 to schedule your appointment – it's FREE!
